## Writing a Letter

In general, letters without a phone call follow-up will generate a 5% response. It is extremely important that letters be followed up by a phone call in order to answer questions and gain a response. The best way to gain support is a letter followed by a personal call/visit. Believe it or not, the 5% favorable responses jump to 60% when a personal call/visit is made!

- State your interest in a short-term team. Share with them why you want to go, and how God has been working in you to lead you to this point.
- State the objectives of your trip, what country you will visit, and the kind of ministry you will be doing. Include here a little bit about why this is needed and a little about the organization with whom you are going.
- Outline your total cost for the trip (*between \$3,000 & \$3,500*). Explain how you would like them to be involved and why you are asking them. Review the purpose of your trip (results of dollars they will invest).
- Tell them exactly how they can respond (per the Donor's response form):
  - o Who to make check payable to (*Church name*)

Here are some suggestions for the content of your letter;

- Where to mail it to (*Trip leader or missions office at church*)
- o When you need it (You can choose this. It should be early enough that they won't forget it, but not so early as to put a hardship on them. Definitely a week before we leave (*April 18gh*, 2008).
- o Thank them for considering this. Tell them that you will be calling/visiting with them:
  - To answer any questions that they might have"

## Sample letter for Christian friends and relatives
